Sunday 08 October 2017 Alison McNeill (voice) and Sasha Savaloni (guitar)

Scottish soprano Alison McNeill and Iranian-Scottish guitarist Sasha Savaloni are Enterprise Music Scotland's 2015-2017 Artists in Residence Award recipients. Both Masters graduates of the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland, they made their debut in 2011 at the Big Guitar Weekend Festival, gaining a mention in the Classical Guitar Magazine, and have since established themselves as the foremost voice and guitar duo in Scotland.

They will perform newly commissioned work from composer Stuart MacRae on the theme of 'pilgrimage'. The work will take influence from Persian poetry.

Recent successes include winning the Governors' Recital Prize for Chamber Music at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland. The concert will feature works by Gershwin, Shostakovich and Piazzolla, and their own versions of 'Tea For Two' and 'Loch Lomond'.

He has performed all over the world, and has appeared as a Piano Concerto soloist with the Hallé Orchestra, the Orchestra of Scottish Opera, the Beijing Symphony Orchestra (China), and the Ho Chi Minh City Symphony Orchestra (Vietnam).

Peter's programme includes JS Bach's Suite from the Violin Partita in E major, Schubert's Piano Sonata in B flat major, Rachmaninoff's Piano Sonata Number 2 in B flat minor and Variations on 'Light my Fire' by The Doors.

Sunday 11 March 2018 New Focus (sax/piano duo)

Konrad Wiszniewski (saxophones) and Euan Stevenson (piano).

This talented and versatile duo performed to great acclaim with the Glasgow String Quartet during the 2017 Edinburgh Jazz Festival. They will play a set-list that's approximately equal parts classical (arr Stevenson-Wiszniewski), New Focus originals and jazz standards. Their own material has both classical and Scottish flavours, and the standards are their own arrangements. The classical section features Chopin (Nocturne in E Flat), the Skye Boat Song (arranged with Chopin's Prelude in G major), Bartok (Mikrokosmos) and Liszt (Liebestraum).
